# Smoggy Skies Act

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for H.R. 806—a bill that delays implementation of key air pollution standards, and permanently weakens the Clean Air Act. Ground-level ozone—commonly known as smog—is a dangerous air pollutant that increases preventable health risks, especially for vulnerable groups including children, the elderly, and people with heart and lung disease. Increased ozone pollution will lead to more frequent asthma attacks, increased emergency rooms visits, and premature deaths. The Clean Air Act is responsible for cleaner air and healthier communities, and delaying standards and doubling the time between updating them from five to ten years is irresponsible.

**Members of Congress should be held accountable for their willingness to turn their backs on their constituents' health and refusing to stop the increase of harmful air pollutants. Every American deserves clean air, but this callous vote jeopardizes that right while increasing health risks and rolling back hard-won environmental progress.**
