# Tax Cuts for the Rich & Wealthy Corporations at the expense of Middle Class Families

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The representatives below voted to cut taxes for millionaires, billionaires, and wealthy corporations at the expense of the middle class. The final bill changes many deductions that middle-class families depend on, including the state and local tax deduction—an important provision for many suburban residents that used to effectively prevent double taxation. Instead of ensuring that the wealthy pay their fair share, this bill cuts the corporate tax rate permanently from 35 percent to 21 percent at a cost of nearly \$1.4 trillion over 10 years, and lines the pockets of hedge fund CEOs and real estate tycoons. By adding to the deficit, the legislation also puts middle-class priorities such as Medicare, Medicaid, education, and infrastructure at risk. Additionally, 13 million fewer Americans will have health coverage under this bill and premiums will skyrocket.

The bill is a giveaway to the wealthy, at the expense of everyday Americans. One analysis shows that by 2027, 83 percent of the tax cuts would funnel to the top 1 percent while 57 percent of households earning less than \$200,000 would see their taxes go up—a tax increase on 92 million middle-class families.

**Members of Congress should oppose this bill because it threatens programs that millions of Americans rely on and could cause tax hikes for middle-class families. With this callous vote, these Representatives sold out their constituents to give billionaires and big corporations a massive tax break.**
