

RUBBER STAMP REPS

Unfairly Criminalizing Immigrants

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

Issue Background

The below representatives voted for an anti-immigrant bill that would make it easier to indiscriminately deport immigrants, including those fleeing gang violence. The bill creates a new sweeping definition of the term "criminal gang" and would allow the administration to classify immigrants as gang members with little or no proof—subjecting them to harsh penalties or deportation. Immigration laws already provide the government with the ability to deport individuals engaged in criminal activity, but this bill unnecessarily demonizes immigrant communities. This bill also raises due process concerns, allowing the administration to target people based on the mere suspicion of gang affiliation and charge all those who seem in any way connected to that individual as members of the gang.

Members of Congress should oppose this bill because it promotes racial profiling and criminalizes the immigrant community. This bill boosts the administration cruel agenda and extreme plans to indiscriminately deport all immigrants.
