

## RUBBER STAMP REPS

# Weakening Hiring Standards for U.S. Customs and Border Protection

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for HR 2213—a bill that would enable and expand this Administration's deportation force by weakening hiring standards at U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). The bill eliminates polygraph tests for certain applicants—despite ongoing problems with abuse and corruption at CBP. In the past these polygraphs have uncovered hundreds of admissions of criminal activity including drug smuggling, violent crime, and sexual abuse.

**Members of Congress should oppose this bill on its merits, and doubly so because it's a naked attempt to recruit new members, no matter how unsuitable their backgrounds, for this Administration's deportation force.**
