

RUBBER STAMP REPS

Harming Women's Health and Increasing Unsafe Abortions

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for H.R. 7, a bill that would increase women's health risks by making it more difficult to access a safe abortion. Taxpayer dollars already cannot fund abortions, but this bill would make it even more likely that abortions would not be covered by Medicaid or private health insurance as part of the Affordable Care Act, even if it were recommended by a doctor.
