# Repealing Online Privacy Protections

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for S.J. Res. 34, which would allow internet providers to invade the personal privacy of every American and sell their information without consent. It would remove privacy protections and allow providers to collect, store, share, and sell customer information to marketing companies, giving big internet corporations the ability to profit off of the private lives of Americans. It also removes requirements enforcing providers to ask internet users if they would like to share their browsing history on the web and enables internet providers to sell that information without asking permission.

**Members of Congress must be held accountable for voting to violate privacy standards and enable internet providers to profit from personal data. This undermines our core values and is a threat to the privacy protections of all Americans.**
