# Repeal of Stream Protection Standards

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for H.J. Res. 38, which would repeal a standard designed to prevent companies from dumping mine waste into waterways. These practices destroy mountain streams, increase pollution, and pose public health risks for thousands Americans living downstream from mining sites.

**Members of Congress should be held accountable for their vote to make it easier for big companies to freely pollute waterways and endanger children's and communities' health. They have a responsibility to protect Americans from health threats, not expose thousands of them to toxic chemicals and heavy metals in their water.**
