# Weakening Overtime Protections

Dozens of House members represent districts where the majority of the constituents voted against this administration's platform, yet these representatives are acting as rubber stamps for the White House's extreme agenda rather than working for the people they represent.

### Issue Background

The below Representatives voted for H.R. 1180—a bill that weakens the rights of hard-working Americans to earn overtime pay for working more than 40 hours per week. It would allow employers to exchange overtime pay for a later promise of time off, but no guarantee that it could be taken when it's needed. This gives a new right to employers to dictate compensation, with no new benefit for workers. The bill is disguised as a way to provide more flexibility for workers, when in reality it is an attack on their time, pay, and flexibility allowing employers to determine when time off can be taken.

**Members of Congress should be held accountable for voting to weaken working Americans' rights to a fair wage for every hour they work. Rather than fairly compensating employees for being away from their family, this bill creates a false promise of flexibility for workers and only benefits employers.**
